OZSKY "ALUMNI" 2024: FINAL WRAP-UP REPORT

2024 continued the celebrations of our 31st Anniversary of running these unique Southern Skies Observing Adventures which originally started back in 1993 at an event which we called "Operation Pacific Storm", morphing through various name changes including the "Aussie Sky Safaris" and "Deepest South Texas Star Safaris".

It has since grown and changed significantly over the past 31 years into what is now an amazing bucket-list astronomy event known across the world as "The OzSky Star Safari".

It has always been our intention to run the "Alumni" edition of the OzSky Star Safari as a laid-back, relaxed gathering of friends under some dark skies with some great telescopes, and without all the usual rigid schedules of regular star parties or even those less rigid but still well-known schedules of the OzSky "Classic" Star Safaris for that matter – I think we achieved that this year (and hope you all do too).

THE OBSERVING

We were incredibly lucky to enjoy beautifully clear, dark skies on six out of the seven observing nights during the week, however despite ample opportunities for severe cases of "Photon Fatigue", some of the observers continued throughout the night right up until sunrise on the final day.

Most nights saw several people observing right through until the morning Sun started to interfere, with about half of the group retiring before 01:00AM most nights, leaving several telescopes unused and fully available thereafter.

The average SQM readings (using a combination of SQM and SQM-L devices) across the week ranged between the superb values of 21.48 - 21.77 mag/arcsec².

- 2 × 25" f/5.0 Obsession Telescopes
- 2 × 18" f/4.5 Obsession Telescopes
- 1 × 18" f/4.2 Ultra-Compact Obsession Telescope

All the telescopes available at the OzSky "Alumni" Star Safari are owned by the 3 Rivers Foundation (3RF) in Texas, USA and made available for your use during these unique events.
